Relax and Enjoy

These homeowners were avid wine collectors, so it only made sense that they needed a climate controlled wine cellar which could safeguard and store their variety of wines. A combination of wood and metal "Vintage View" wine-racking was used for wine and glassware. The cork flooring, hand painted mural and wine barrel table for wine tasting adds visual variety and beauty. Tempered glass along the staircase and elegant stone columns create a stunning view of the wine cellar. This cozy wine cellar with a full entrance glass door is the perfect space to relax, uncork and unwind.



Designed with a Purpose

This home was renovated in order to provide increased mobility for the homeowner's son Todd who is wheelchair bound. By removing all the interior walls the space opened up Todd's ability to easily maneuver and be a part of family activities. ADA height countertops allow for wheelchair access as well as durable engineered flooring. The roll-in elevator now replaces the staircase allowing the entire first floor living area to be one large space. An ADA kitchenette and ADA roll in-shower were also added. The fully automatic rail system allows easy access from therapy room to kitchenette and bathroom easing the physical requirements of Todd's care. When not in use the elevator sits flush into the main level floor creating an open airy gathering space.



Splashes of Glam

Drab carpet, dated fixtures and mirrors and a dull paint color made this bathroom feel dark and dated. A jetted tub sat unused by the window adjacent to the small shower. This stunning new master bathroom now boasts granite countertops, sleek chrome plumbing fixtures and white lacquered floating vanities. The shower was made larger and now has a bench, shower niche and large rain head. An electrified, fogless mirror was incorporated into the tile to be functional yet seamless. The free-standing soaking tub is accented by an unexpected, chrome plated chandelier. Heated towel bars provide a warm, cozy towel while stepping onto the heated metallic porcelain floors.
